#### **Common name:**

Chincherinchee,

### Palatability to Livestock:

Eaten occasionally.

# **Toxicity to Goats:**

Unknown.

### **Toxicity to Other Species:**

Domestic pets, sheep, horses.

# **Poisonous Principle:**

- . Colchicine
- . Cardiac glycocides,
- . Saponins,
- . Resins, volatile oils, calcium oxalate crystals.

#### **Effects:**

Signs and Symptoms:

- . Nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain,
- . Gastric irritation,
- . Dermatitis after long contact.

#### *Health and Production Problems:*

. Be aware of potential health problems.

#### Treatment:

. See Vet.


# **Integrated Control Strategy:**

. Do not allow stock to eat this plant.

#### **Comments:**

- . Garden plants,
- . NB daffodil, jonquil, narcissis, muscari, hyacinth, are all toxic.
- .A garden plant in subtropical and temperate regions of Australia.
- . Native of S Africa.
- . Bulbous herb with thick flowering stems.
- . Leaves are strap-like and succulent, and usually wither before flowering takes place.

- . Flowers are white, with a yellow-green blotch at the base, yellow stamens, star shaped with six petals, clustered as a compact pyramid, spring to summer flowering.
- . After flowering. a capsule with 3 chambers, containing numerous small black seeds appears.
- . All parts are toxic esp bulb, also skin a irritant.
